

Another busy month in Hanney, with plenty going on around the Village.

The "hanging" footpath at Hunters Avenue has been resolved, and in conjunction with the Residents Association, we have a connection

between the developments. (See photo)

Next up is the allotment path which will be upgraded along the brook side of the allotments.

Then the corner of the village hall by the MUGA will be sloped to remove the rough edge. All of this is funded through PC (Parish Council) grants.

The flood team - working in conjunction with us - have raised £18k towards culvert and ditch maintenance. Works along Ebbs Lane will start soon. Our thanks to everyone involved.



The Council also agreed to fund a flood ramp that should help prevent water flowing down Halls Lane from the brook.

At the Black Horse bus stop next to the shelter, there will be a new cycle rack installed, funded by the Council.

Bloor Homes -we have requested that they don't use the PC's name without express written consent, as they recently mis-quoted us regarding the proposed development.

Thank you to everyone who helped plant 400 colourful and flowering trees! We hope you enjoy watching them grow over the coming years.

Thames Water - the PC has asked for a public scrutiny of the increase in cost from £2.2bn to £6.5bn. Don't forget public consultation is open until 13th Jan - have your say at www.ipsos.uk/SESRO

At a recent General Meeting of the Wantage and Grove Campaign

Group, it was decided to dissolve the Group.

Funds in their bank totalling £1,600, have been split between the October Club and Wantage Museum.

the relevant page on the OCC website. It is not really very clear - there's a surprise! but I gathered that I may have been wrong in the September article.



"I'm dreaming of a White Christmas" – goes the old song. But this year some people are talk-

But this year some people are talking about a "Blue Christmas". That is, a Christmas for those who are not

feeling "Christmassy" – whether because of personal circumstances or because of the current state of the world, which makes many of us feel somewhat demoralised and perhaps disillusioned.

Traditionally Advent was the "blue" season, a time to focus on the darkness of the world before going on to celebrate the light and joy of Christmas.

But Christmas also has its dark side. The story of a young couple about to give birth finding themselves homeless in Bethlehem. Or worse still, the same young couple forced to flee and becoming refugees in Egypt. Or worse even than that, the story of the babies of Bethlehem massacred by King Herod.

The 16th century Coventry Carol is an evocative expression of this darkness, with its heart-rending words:

That woe is me, poor Child for Thee! And ever mourn and sigh,

For thy parting neither say nor sing, Bye, bye, lully, lullay.

Words that will match the feelings of too many in our world today.

So Christmas is not an escape from reality. The first Christmas took place in a world not unlike ours, riven with war and violence, poverty and oppression. But it is out of

that darkness that the light of Christmas comes – the story of the birth of a very special human being.

This was a man who loved everybody, who cared for the poor, healed the sick, lifted up the downhearted, challenged the powerful, and empowered the weak. He was like a dazzling light in a dark world. He brought people joy and hope – and still does today. He has been an inspiration to millions of people through the ages. If I didn't believe in God, I would still think him worth following.

His birth is good news – still worth celebrating today. What better time to gather friends and family, give time to each other, and try to include everybody.

A light in the darkness - a light we can still celebrate and share with those around us. So whatever is happening in the world, may the message of Christmas bring you joy and hope this Christmas time – a joy and a hope that we can discover even more when we share it with others.

£200,000 taken from criminals going to local crime prevention initiatives.

I have recently announced the award of nearly £200,000 to 49 community and voluntary organisations to support crime prevention initiatives.

My Community Fund is always hugely over subscribed with 248 applications submitted for over



£1.7m of funding, so unfortunately I know many will be disappointed.

The Community Fund provides support to voluntary and community groups that help to prevent crime and keep communities safe. Importantly, money for the Community Fund comes from proceeds from the sale of items seized from criminals that cannot be returned to their rightful owners, and court orders, making criminals pay, rather than the cash coming from taxpayers.

I'm delighted that we are able to take money away from criminals and use it in a positive way, to support many of our hard-working communities and voluntary organisations in the Thames Valley to reduce crime further.

In total there are 49 schemes funded across the whole of Thames Valley. To give a flavour of the types of projects supported, here are a few of the local applications that were successful...

Bright Futures Oxfordshire, Youth mentoring scheme - £5,000.00 Didcot and Wallingford Didcot TRAIN, Inspiring young people - £6,000.00

Improving Road Safety in Long Wittenham - £5,700.00 Sandford-on-Thames Road Safety Initiative - £3,300.00

Gloves Not Gangs, Spartans Boxing Club, Abingdon - £4,000.00

Sweatbox Youth Work, Wantage - £5,000.00

Abingdon Damascus Youth, The Gazebo Project - £4,000.00

CCTV at Thomas Hughes Memorial Hall - £1,500.00

Fraud and Scam Awareness, Vale Community Impact - £5,000.00
